2017 CHANTRY CHINOOK CLASSIC SALMON DERBY DECEMBER UPDATE

The committee is busy preparing for the 2017 Derby; with a little new information to report at this time.

In analyzing the 2016 Derby, the committee again prepared pie charts for demographics and location of the entrants. See the attachments to look at the pie charts for details. You may draw your own conclusions on the outcome.

The figures shown only include those who were registered on Derby tickets. It does not include the youth who participated in Kid's Day, estimated to be over 300 with no ticket required.

The Derby rules have been edited and updated to provide some clarification of Ladies' and Senior's Days and to provide information on awarding prizes. See details on the website and also to be included in the brochure.


There are again some changes to the prize structure for 2017. The Derby winning Largest Salmon and Trout are not eligible for the first week largest Salmon and Trout prize.

(In these cases the 2nd placed entry will win). Special Weight prize closest to 9.34 lbs is now divided with the Salmon and Trout. Salmon is a \$250.00 gift certificate from Lake Huron Rod and Gun. Trout is a gift certificate from J & S Tackle. Largest Salmon during the last three days has been dropped. Hidden Weight Prize improved to a \$75.00 gift Certificate at Lake Huron Rod and Gun or J & S Tackle

The Derby has contributed \$15,000.00 to the Lake Huron Fishing Club from the proceeds of the 2016 Derby. These monies will assist the club to continue to contribute to the health of our fisheries and ensure a healthy future for the next generation of anglers.

The formal cheque presentation will take place at the Club Christmas gathering in December.

The committee will again be hosting charity BBQs in 2017. The first will be at the Port



Elgin Home Hardware and Building Centre on May 20th, with the secound at Your Independent Grocer in Port Elgin on July 1st. We are looking at more sites and dates.






TROUT HATCHERY UPDATE

Our brown trout have all been released for this year. A total of 57,517 fish with a total weight of 1,756 kilograms were released in 18 stocking trips. I want to thank all of the volunteers who helped net fish and drove trucks and trailers all over Bruce and Grey Counties to put fish into the water. A large job, like fish stocking, is pretty easy when many people participate.

A big thank you goes out to Don Merritt for cleaning and disinfecting all of our tanks when they were emptied of fish. This is a big, unpleasant job that is necessary two times each year. All of our rainbows have been transferred to the clean, larger tanks now and should be really starting to pick up their growth. This morning we moved 12,400 rainbows to the Port Elgin Chinook Hatchery to spend the winter. The big job now is to get our new finishing tanks inside the hatchery and installed. We have had good help with the excavations and piping reconfigurations required for the new tanks. We have a separate team of people trying to figure out how to get the tanks, which weigh 900 lbs each, into the hatchery and into position over the excavations.

Our target is to have the tanks ready for service by the end of the year. As usual, we have some snowbirds heading south and also a few people on the disabled list. If any member



would like to help out on a hatchery crew for the winter months please contact me.

LHFC SCHOOL HATCHERY PROGRAM UPDATE

On November 18, the 6 o'clock CTV London News found out a bit more about the LHFC School Salmon Hatchery program at Brookside P.S. Scott Miller showed up and interviewed myself, teacher Larry Grail, and three students about the program.

The LHFC School Salmon Hatchery Program, in partnership with Bruce Power, is benefitting more than just our local schools. We have formed a partnership between LHFC and the following five clubs: Bluewater Anglers and their four schools in Sarnia;

Sydenham Sportsmen's Association and their two new schools; one of the Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association members will be helping with the Wiarton School joining SSA & LHFC; United Fish & Game Clubs of Manitoulin and their one school; Canadian Bass Anglers Federation with one of the members from Waterloo/ Wellington/Mississauga clubs helping out with a Guelph school; and Forest City Bassmasters helping out with one school in London and one school in Komoka.

This is great to see and as a result there will be 34 schools or so involved with the program. That should add up to over 1,000 students directly involved with raising the salmon in their classrooms or libraries, from Sarnia to Milton to Manitoulin Island. We would like to send a huge "Thank You" to Bruce Power for making this a reality!
